Did You Know? The History of GASFA

In October 1989, a group of 12 individuals serving as Facility and Maintenance Directors of K-12 Schools met in Augusta, Ga. to create a statewide organization that became known as the Georgia Association of School Facility Administrators (GASFA). On February 5, 1990 GASFA was incorporated. In July 1990, the 1st Annual Conference & Trade Show took place on Jekyll Island, with 70 school personnel and 40 vendors attending. Today, we have 275 school facility administrators, 180+ sponsors, and 500+ vendor representatives at the 2024 Annual Conference & Trade Show.
